Aqiqah is a Muslim ceremony that takes place to welcome a new baby into the Islamic community.

Muslims believe that Allah made the universe in 6 periods. He made the night cover the day and he created the sun, moon and stars. He also vegetation, animals and humans.

Each year, Muslims who are able to, fast during Ramadan, the ninth month of the Islamic calendar.

Muslims pray five times a day. They must always face **Mecca** in Saudi Arabia.
