Stained glass windows are a key aspect of places of worship as they illustrate key parts of Jesus’ life.➤ Worship music can tell us what religions believe and teach.

Holy Week Diaries

- Easter is the most important festival in the Christian calendar. It celebrates **Jesus** rising from the dead, three days after he was executed. The week leading up to Easter is called **Holy Week**.
- **Palm Sunday** This is the Sunday before Easter Sunday. It is the first day of Holy Week and celebrates Jesus's arrival in Jerusalem riding on a donkey.
- **Maundy Thursday** This is the Thursday before Easter Day. On Maundy Thursday Christians remember when Jesus ate the Passover meal with his disciples, breaking bread and drinking wine. Christians refer to this meal as the Last Supper.
- **Good Friday:** Good Friday is the Friday before Easter Sunday. It commemorates the execution of Jesus by **crucifixion**.
- **Easter Sunday:** Easter Sunday marks Jesus' **resurrection**
