What I Should Already Know:

- Recognise that sacred texts contain stories and teachings which are special to many people and should be treated with respect.
- A Jewish place of worship is called a Synagogue. Jews used synagogues to meet, worship and study.

Unit Specific Vocabulary:

Slave: a person who is the legal property of another and is forced to obey them.

Egyptian: a native of ancient or modern Egypt, or a person of Egyptian descent.

Pharaoh: A Pharaoh was the most important and powerful person in Egypt. The Pharaoh was the political and religious leader of the Egyptian people.

The people of Egypt considered the Pharaoh to be a half-man, half-god

Sukkot: is a major Jewish festival held in the autumn to commemorate the sheltering of the Israelites in the wilderness. It is marked by the erection of small booths covered in natural materials.

Torah: means laws. It is the sacred book for Jews

Israelite: a member of the ancient Hebrew nation.

Exodus: a mass departure of people.

Ten Commandments: The **Ten Commandments** are laws or rules handed down to Moses by God on Mount Sinai.

Moses was a religious leader, lawgiver and prophet, who is considered to be the most important prophet in Judaism.

Moses is believed to have led the Exodus of Hebrews from Egypt, saving his people.

Moses was given the Ten commandments by God. He lived until 120 but died before reaching the Land of Israel.
