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What I Should Already Know:

Jesus chose 12 special friends to be his disciples. The disciples listened carefully to what Jesus said and told other people all about Jesus and what he did.

The Bible is a sacred text for Christians. The New Testament includes many stories from the founder of Christianity, Jesus.

Lent is a time in the Christian calendar. It comes just before Easter and lasts for around six weeks. During Lent, Christians often abstain from something, such as a favourite food or drink. Some Christians might fast during the day.

Jesus inspired and influenced many of his followers whilst he was alive and continues to influence many people today

In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus explains to his followers what kinds of human lives are blessed by God. The statements he made are known as the Beatitudes Jesus is the central figure of Christianity, Jesus preached wherever people would gather. Jesus taught through telling short stories with important messages. These are called parables. Jesus' parables taught moral values that can support and guide Christianity then today

Disciples: followers of Jesus

Holy Week: The week leading up to Easter is called **Holy Week**.

Palm Sunday: This is the Sunday before Easter Sunday. It is the first day of Holy Week and celebrates Jesus's arrival in **Jerusalem** riding on a donkey

Maundy Thursday: This is the Thursday before Easter Day. On Maundy Thursday Christians remember when Jesus ate the **Passover meal** with his disciple.

Last Supper: Many Christians remember the Last Supper by sharing bread and wine together in a church service called Holy Communion, Eucharist or Mass. It is a reminder that Jesus sacrificed his life for mankind

Passover: Passover is a celebration of the story of **Exodus**. On the evening before Passover starts, Jews have a special service called a **Seder** (Order). This takes place over a meal with family and friends at home.

Good Friday: Good Friday is the Friday before Easter Sunday. It commemorates the execution of Jesus by **crucifixion**

Resurrection: Easter Sunday marks Jesus's **resurrection**.

Easter: Easter is the most important festival in the Christian calendar. It celebrates **Jesus** rising from the dead, three days after he was executed.
