<b>Year 4 Spring 1</b>	<p><b>Why is Jesus so inspiring to some people?</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>➤ Jesus (also known as Jesus Christ or Jesus of Nazareth) was a preacher and religious leader.</li><li>➤ Christians believe that Jesus performed miracles for example healing the sick and creating food and drink for those in need.</li><li>➤ Jesus inspired and influenced many of his followers whilst he was alive and continues to influence many people today.</li><li>➤ In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus explains to his followers what kinds of human lives are blessed by God. The statements he made are known as the Beatitudes.</li></ul>

### What does it mean to be a Sikh today?

- The Sikh place of worship is called a **Gurdwara** which means 'Gateway to Guru'. A Gurdwara is any building where the Guru Granth Sahib is kept.
- The Guru Granth Sahib is a collection of lessons from the ten gurus. It is kept on a raised platform under a canopy in the Sikh place of worship. All Sikhs take off their shoes when they are near it.
- Sikhism was founded by a man called **Guru Nanak**. Guru Nanak is considered the first Sikh Guru. Sikhism is still based on his teachings and those of the nine Sikh Gurus who followed him.
