What I Should Already Know:

A Jewish place of worship is called a Synagogue. Jews use synagogues to meet, worship and study.

Jewish people believe God created the universe. The stories of how he did this are at the beginning of Genesis, which is the first book of the Torah.

Jews, who follow the religion of Judaism, have special food rules; these are called the laws of kosher. The laws of kosher deal with what is fit for Jews to eat.

Bar and Bat Mitzvahs are ceremonies in which a child becomes an adult in God's eyes and they promise to keep God's commandments.

Mikveh is a Jewish ritual bath.

Moses was a religious leader, lawgiver and prophet, who is considered to be the most important prophet in Judaism.
