What I Should Already Know:

- Baptism is <u>Christian ceremony</u> in which a <u>baby</u> is given a <u>name</u> and welcomed into the <u>Christian Church</u>.
- The story of Noah and the flood can be found in the Old Testament and tells us about how Noah trusted God.
- The Old Testament contains stories and writings from before the birth of Jesus. It contains the story of Jonah and the Whale.
- Hinduism is one of the oldest of the world's surviving religions and it originated near the Indus River in India.

Subject Vocabulary:

Christianity: A religion based on a belief in God and the life and teachings of Jesus.

Christian: Someone who believes in the teachings of Jesus and a follower of the religion of Christianity.

Hinduism: It is over 4,000 years old, making it one of the world's oldest religions. It is made up of a variety of different religious beliefs and practices.

Hindu: A follower of Hinduism

Islam: A religion based on the teachings of Qur'an.

Muslim: A follower of the religion of Islam.

Judaism: The religions of the Jewish people.

Jew: A person that follows the Jewish religion.

Baptism: <u>Christian</u> <u>ceremony</u> in which a <u>baby</u> is given a <u>name</u> and welcomed into the <u>Christi</u>an <u>Church</u>.

Jesus: The founder of Christianity

Ceremony: Ceremonies are held on special occasions and usually celebrate or remember something important. They also help make significant things official.

Pilgrimage: A pilgrimage is a special journey to a place that is important for religious reasons

Wudu: Muslims use water to wash before each of their five daily prayers or before handling the Qur'an.

Mikveh: A Mikveh is a pool of naturally gathered water (from either rain, river or sea) that is used for ritual cleansing.

Ritual: a ceremony or series of acts that is always performed the same way.

Rite of Passage: part of growing up ceremony.

What I should know by the end of the Unit:

- Ritual bathing in the Ganges is an important part of Hindu pilgrimage.
- All Christian Churches have rituals involving the use of water. Children may be Christened using holy water or adults can be baptised.
- Baptism is mentioned in the Bible when Jesus was baptised by John in the River Jordan in Israel.
- Muslims use water to wash before each of their five daily prayers or before handling the Qur'an. This is called Wudu.
