What I Should Already Know:

The Bible is a sacred text for Christians. The New Testament includes many stories from the founder of Christianity, Jesus. The story of Jesus and Zacchaeus is found in the New Testament.

Lent is a time in the Christian calendar.

Christmas marks the birth of Jesus.

Jesus chose 12 special friends to be his disciples

Christianity has many special places for Christians. Jerusalem: where Jesus did lots of his preaching Bethlehem: where Jesus was born Nazareth: hometown of Jesus and where he spent much of his life.

Many Christians pray a prayer that Jesus told his disciples in the Bible. This special prayer is called the Lord's Prayer.

Inspire: People inspire others by giving them the encouragement, confidence, or enthusiasm to do something well.

Miracle: an extraordinary event taken as a sign of the power of God.

Parables: a simple story with a moral.

Beatitudes: Jesus explains to his followers what kinds of human lives are blessed by God. The statements he made are known as the **Beatitudes**.

Morals: having to do with what is right and what is wrong in how a person acts.

Blessed: something that makes a person happy or content

Subject Vocabulary:

Christianity: A religion based on a belief in God and the life and teachings of Jesus.

Christian: Someone who believes in the teachings of Jesus and a follower of the religion of Christianity.

Jesus: A teacher and the founder of the Christian religion.

Bible: The sacred book of the Christian religion consisting of the Old and New Testament.

What I should know by the end of the Unit:

- Jesus (also know as Jesus Christ or Jesus of Nazareth) was a preacher and religious leader.
- Christians believe that Jesus performed miracles for example, healing the sick and creating food and drink for those in need.
- Jesus inspired and influenced many of his followers whilst he was alive and continues to influence many people today.
- In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus explains to his followers what kinds of human lives are blessed by God. The statements he made are known as the Beatitudes.
