What I Should Already Know:

To know that people can be/think differently.

A celebration is a special occasion. People come together and celebrate because something enjoyable has happened.

Subject Vocabulary:

Belong: To belong is to be in a place or a group where you feel safe, secure and valued.

Community: A community is a group of people living or working together or who have shared interest.

Religion: A system of faith or worship linked to one or many Gods.

Christianity: A religion based on the teachings of Jesus Christ. Followers are called Christians.

Judaism: A religion with one God. Followers are called Jewish people.

Islam: A religion based on the Qur'an. Followers are called Muslims.

Unit Specific Vocabulary:

Aqiqah: The Muslim ceremony that takes places to welcome a new baby into the Islamic community.

Church: The Christian place of worship.

Synagogue: The Jewish place of worship.

Mosque: The Muslim place of worship.

Shabbat: The Jewish day of rest, taking place each Friday evening until Saturday evening.
