Knowledge Focus	Lives of Significant Individuals			
National Curriculum Knowledge	Pupils should be taught about the lives of significant individuals in the past who have contributed to national achievements. Some should be used to compare aspects of life in different periods.			
Year 1	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Know about a famous person from the past and explain why they are famous <p>THEMES: Chronology - Then and Now, Change & Continuity, Similarity & Difference, Significance, Interpretation & Enquiry.</p> <p>Key Knowledge:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Pupils grasp that Florence is principally remembered as a nurse, a long time ago and was connected with a major war. Children can grasp that Florence had a long life helping soldiers and then developing nursing after the war. They can explain some key points about Mary's life They know what she did to improve soldier's lives in terms of providing food, comfort etc They know that she was brave and visited the battlefield to tend to injured soldiers Pupils can give reasons why Mary & Florence deserve a statue in a prominent place after all this time They know about Edith Cavell and compare her life to Mary & Florence They know that Edith was brave because she was at risk herself and can say why she is a significant person.
