

Great Fire of London Words:

Buildings - a structure with a roof and walls, such as a house or factory

City - a large town which usually has a cathedral

Rebuild - build (something) again after it has been damaged or destroyed

Flammable - easily set on fire

Firefighters - a person whose job it is to extinguish fires
