

<h3>Key Facts:</h3> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- There is always an upside-down question mark at the beginning of a question: ¿Cómo te llamas?</li> <li>- There is always an upside-down exclamation mark at the beginning of an exclamation: ¡Hola!</li> <li>- ll is pronounced as /y/</li> <li>- y is pronounced as /e/</li> <li>- ñ - the mark above an n is called a tilde and creates a /y/ sound</li> <li>- Accents above letters (á,é,í,ó,ú) show which letter in a word to emphasise</li> </ul>
