Buenos días – Good morning/Good day
 Hola – Hello
 Adiós – Goodbye
 Hasta luego – See you later
 Hasta mañana – See you tomorrow
 Gracias – Thank you
 Muy bien – Very good
 ¿Qué tal? – How are you?
 Estoy bien, gracias – I am good thank you
 Regular – Not too bad
 No estoy bien – I am not good
 Estoy fatal – I'm feeling terrible
 ¿Y tú? ¿Y usted? – And you?
 ¿Cómo te llamas? – What is your name?
 ¿Cómo se llama? – What is his/her name?
 Me llamo... – My name is...
 Ella se llama... - Her name is...
 El se llama... - His name is...
 ¿Cuántos años tienes? – How old are you?
 Tengo ... años – I am years old

Key Facts:

- There is always an upside-down question mark at the beginning of a question: ¿Cómo te llamas?
- There is always an upside-down exclamation mark at the beginning of an exclamation: ¡Hola!
- ll is pronounced as /y/
- y is pronounced as /e/
- ñ - the mark above an n is called a tilde and creates a /y/ sound
- Accents above letters (á,é,í,ó,ú) show which letter in a word to emphasise
