

2. For information on your child's learning for each term, click on the *Year Group Curriculum Information* icon.



Be Safe


Be Kind

KEY MESSAGES

Home Learning

We value any support that can be provided at home with home learning. We encourage all children to read daily, and share their reading with an adult where possible.

Please also spend time with your child rehearsing their spellings. These will be given weekly and will be checked by adults in school.

It would also be helpful if you and your child could spend time ensuring that they are fluent with their times tables/number facts and practising their quiz questions which will also be practised at school on a weekly basis.

Keeping Children Safe in School

This is something we take seriously. If you have any concerns or questions, please remember our Designated Safeguarding Leads are Mrs Randall and Mrs Bown.

Water Bottles

We encourage all children to bring a *clear* water bottle into school. Only water may be brought in unless an acceptable alternative has been agreed with Assistant Headteacher, Mrs Randall. An additional water or juice bottle can be brought in for lunch times if desired.

We have some children who have serious nut allergies, we must therefore aim to be a nut free School and ask for your support in ensuring **any food** that your child brings into School is **nut free**.
